Africa Showdown May Be Delayed By Bad Weather
Ground Action in Tunisia Slowed by Rain and Snow; Bombers Attack Enemy Targets
LONDON, Feb. 12. (AP)—A DNB dispatch broadcast by the German radio today and heard by The Associated Press said that a force of British and Americans which attempted a strong assault on the Axis positions on the northern slope of the Atlas mountains in Tunisia had "fallen into an ambush and been wiped out." There was no confirmation of this report from any official Allied source and a communique from North Africa said there had been "nothing to report" from the Tunisian ground forces.

U. S. Bombers Stage Double-Barreled Attack On Convoy Evacuating Troops
WASHINGTON, Feb. 12. (AP)—The navy reported today that Japanese positions at Munda and Kibimaru had been bombed Thursday and large fires started in the target areas. Munda on New Georgia Island is the principal air base in the central Solomon and is 180 nautical miles northwest of the American airfield on newly conquered Guadalcanal. Kibimaru is about 10 miles beyond Munda and is another enemy air base.
